

Dulles Chased from Geneva

DULLES is returning from Geneva. His excuse that he has more important business to attend to here than at this vital conference is a typical Dulles insult to the intelligence of the American people. The unvarnished truth is that he is coming back because his policy has suffered shipwreck. He is literally being driven out of Geneva by a hostile world opinion.

The Dulles-Eisenhower line has all along been to spread the Indochina war. This was the meaning of the reckless brandishing of the H-bomb just a while back, the repeated bombing threats against the USSR and People's China, the air-lift by American planes from France to Indochina, the sending of American technicians into the war, the attempt to gut the Geneva conference by increased war moves prior to it by the United States, Britain, and France, and the proposal to found an "Asian alliance" which leaves out all the great countries of Asia.

Dulles, however, has been receiving one rebuff after another to this whole warlike policy. The overwhelming masses of the people of the world are opposed to war and they want the dangerous Indochina war brought to an end at the Geneva conference. That is why the capitalist rulers of Britain and France did not dare to accept the Dulles warmongering proposals to scuttle the Geneva conference and

to open up the Indochina war full scale. They, at least, have to go through the motions of peace-making under the powerful demand from their peoples that they end the war.

NIXON'S recent notorious speech was no mere slip of the tongue, as they have tried to make it appear, but was carefully calculated in advance. Obviously, the plan to send American troops had been decided upon by the Administration, and Nixon's speech was a "trial balloon" to prepare the masses for the bad news. But the outcry against this new scheme of mass slaughter was so great and so general that it had to be given up, at least for the moment.

The American people have had one Korea, which is quite enough. Dulles, the swash-buckler, was made to look ridiculous in the eyes of the peoples of the world. Score an important victory for the peace-loving masses in the United States.

Although he is returning to this country in disgrace, with his warlike policy stymied, Dulles has by no means abandoned his belligerent attitude regarding Indochina. His very departure from Geneva is an attempt to break up the vital conference. His activity is based upon the arrogant imperialist assumption (and gross illusion) that the peoples of the world cannot take any decisive steps unless the

U.S. misrepresentatives are on hand to tell them what to do.

At the famous meeting of the nine European Communist parties in 1947, which established the Communist Information Bureau, a Russian Party delegate, Zhdanov, made one of the wisest remarks of this century. He said, "It is necessary to remember that between the desire of imperialists to develop a new war and the possibility of organizing such a war there is a great gap." At Geneva, Dulles has once more cracked his head against this elemental truth.

THE BASIC significance of Dulles' return in confusion from Geneva is that he and his warlike policies have been rejected by the peoples of the world. The people of the United States, who fundamentally also do not want his mass slaughter program, should follow up the Geneva repudiation of him and his policies by demanding that he surrender up his high office as American Secretary of State.

This would be a real victory for peace and would administer a staggering blow to the world conquest program of Wall Street, now being militantly advanced by the Eisenhower administration. Dulles should not be allowed to run around the world, misrepresenting the peace-loving American people, by trying to plunge humanity into a third great war. Dulles must go!
