

Foster Changes Vote to 'No' On Party's Draft Resolution

William Z. Foster, national chairman of the Communist Party, who voted a qualified "Yes" for the recently adopted draft resolution of the national committee, has changed his vote to "No."

The change was recorded in a letter received and noted by the national committee last Monday.

The corrected vote now stands: 12 for the resolution, and Foster against the resolution. The 12 include Benjamin J. Davis, Jr., who voted a qualified "Yes"; Eugene Dennis, John Gates, Fred Fine, James E. Jackson, Sidney Stein, Martha Stone, William Schneiderman, Claude Lightfoot, Carl Winter, Edward Strong and Jack Stachel.

Foster will set forth his position in an article in the October issue of "Political Affairs," Marxist theoretical monthly.
