

Togliatti Says Soviet Ousters Spur Initiative of Other CP's

ROME, July 7. — The Soviet Communist Party shakeup points up the need for Communist parties everywhere to follow their own roads to socialism, Italian CP leader Palmiro Togliatti said today. He termed it the most important result of the change.

Togliatti, writing in "L'Unita," the party organ, said the shakeup "has knocked down the barriers—and this is what counts the most—to the search for original roads to socialism in each country, according to its own particularities."

Togliatti said the ouster of the "anti-party group" was "absolutely necessary and fully justified."

He called it a move for "a policy of relaxation of international tension and peaceful coexistence." Now, he said "all the forces (in the Soviet Union) are concentrated on the raising of the standard of living of the masses."

The reorganization, he said, "gave a serious blow to the forces of conservatism and old dogmatism."
