WORKER KILLED

Smash THEM - NOT US

We have seen many accidents and un-safe conditions in this plant, but on Wednesday, Oct. 29, a Brazilian die-maker who attends the automated line on 26 in dept. 9740 DIED because his head was crushed by a die that hit him! Will the company, as usual, say its his fault and deny his family the benefits due to them? Will these fools from Chryslers try to convince us that the man wanted his head crushed, or is this just another example of where we stand in the profit and loss column, our loss and their profit. We cannot look at this as just another accident and turn our head and walk away. The day before, the draw on line 13 had repeated 5 TIMES without anyone having their hands on the buttons. On another line that same Tuesday, a worker had his hand caught under a die and it took OVER 10 minutes to get his hand released. We have seen on many occasions, scrap built up damn near as high as some of these presses with the result being workers hurt and cut because of these un-safe conditions.

It is ALWAYS THE WORKERS who have our fingers, hands cutoff, our bodies maimed while some greedy capitalist bandit (people who own Chryslers, Ford, ECT.) sits back with manicured hands doing nothing but living high off of OUR labor.

WHAT ARE OUR RIGHTS? WHAT CAN WE DO?

Under the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) we workers are entitled to such things as union safety men in this plant, but presently we have only one, and he is on days. Is saving the cost of safety men worth more than the life of ONE WORKER? A THOUSANDS TIMES NO

WE DEMAND THAT THE UNION LEADERS FIGHT TO GET ALL THE BENEFITS DUE TO THIS WORKERS FAMILY!

WE DEMAND OUR RIGHT TO STRIKE OVER UNSAFE WORKING CONDITIONS!
