Unfortunately no comrade from Boston attended the WSA convention. Had we known that a reporter was needed we would have been glad to send someone.

~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ We have heard from some people who attended that the majority of the discussion involved attacking SMC viciously. The sectarian approach they took completely turned off the few people who reported this to us. They also felt there was a mood of despair and frustration -- that the organization is on its last legs. This type of scanty information is not what you want, I know. It was obtained in random ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ conversations during our routine daily work. We will try to hunt up some of these people and see what more we can find out, although this may be difficult as much of it was heard out in Asherst, Mass. We will also forward any leaflets or position papers to you, if they exist and we can get our hands on them, but at present I have nothing concrete to offer at all.
