Dear Campaign Directors and Supporters,

On April 27, 1968 Fred Halstead was one of the main speakers at the antiwar rally of 30,000 in San Francisco. His speech was the best received; interrupted several times by applause; with a standing ovation at the end. The printed speech has been one of our most successful campaign items.

Now a 15 minute 16mm sound film, "Fred Halstead in San Francisco--April 27, 1968," has been produced featuring a major portion of Halstead's speech. It shows the Socialist Workers presidential candidate talking to a massive audience of young, militant antiwar demonstrators -- presenting the revolutionary socialist view on how to build the antiwar movement and on the relationship of the movement to the GIs.

The film can be shown at fund-raising parties and on local TV. It would be an excellent addition to the presentation of a local candidate or trailblazer. It can bring our national campaign to areas where neither Fred nor Paul will be able to appear personally.

Only four copies are available for rental from the national campaign office at a rental fee of \$5.00 plus postage for a 3-day period.

Since there are so few copies and locals will probably want the film in continuous circulation or have it available on short notice we suggest that they obtain their own copy. Cost is \$25.50 plus shipping. It can be made in two days. Send your order to:
