



With the Young Workers

Martin Abern, who is now touring the East reporting on the recent congress of the Young Communist International to which he was delegated by the Young Workers League of America, reports excellent progress. Besides building up the old branches, such as Boston, which has started out to lead the country, he has organized a new branch in Norwood, Mass., of 35 members and another in Newark, N. J., the latter being formed of the majority of the Independent Yipsels there. The meetings are excellent, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, New Jersey and New York having already been covered.

Two things in particular were observed by Comrade Abern: That the "Young Worker", official organ of the Young Workers League, is increasing in circulation and that there is a great need of a junior organization.

From Upper New York State Comrade Abern is proceeding to Chicago, the Twin Cities, and the Great Lakes district where his extensive tour will probably end.
