## Poison Gas Falsehood of Fries and Legion Exposed More than 33 per cent of the American wounded in the world war-

were poison gas casualties, according to a revised report just issued by the adjutant general's office, Washington, D. C.

This is significant in view of the recent backdown of the Senate before the campaign waged by the American Legion led by General Amos A. Fries, chief of the division of chemical warfare, to have the United States cancel its signature to the world protocol prohibiting the use of poison gas in warfare

Gen. Fries' principal argument has been that poison gas is more humane than other war weapons, as in the majority of cases it merely disables the enemy temporarily and makes possible his capture and the winning of the battle.

Instead of poison gas being a mild chloroform to put the enemy into a gentle sleep, the latest government report shows that more than a third of the American wounded in the world war were poison gas casualties-in other words, THEY HAVE NOT YET FULLY RECOV-ERED, DESPITE GEN. FRIES' STATEMENT TO THE CONTRARY. And this report does not take into consideration deaths from poison gas. Evidently Gen. Fries believes in the same kind of false propaganda in favor of the wholesale poisoning of human beings on the battle-


