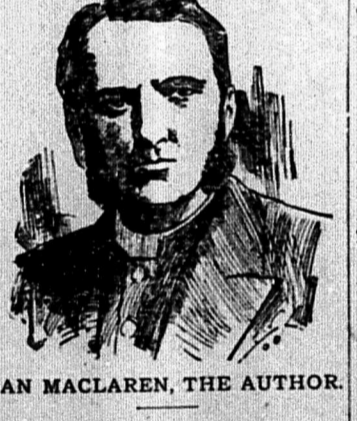

NEWS FOR UNIONISTS
