

KEIR HARDIE BACK AT TASK

Veteran Socialist Has Gigantic Work Ahead of Him in Britain

BY S. G. HOBSON. (Special London Correspondent.) London, April 9.—Keir Hardie has returned to active service after a long "break" owing to ill health and a journey round the world which has taken nearly a year.

Speaking to his fellow M. P.'s this week, Keir Hardie said that he had come back more and more convinced that Socialism was the one hope of the world. We are now all curious as to what will be Keir Hardie's line.

At the last labor conference, held in Hull last January, the labor party, of course in Keir Hardie's absence, by an overwhelming majority declined to insert a declaration in favor of Socialism in its constitution, but by a small majority declared that Socialism was its objective.

Speaking to his fellow M. P.'s this week, Keir Hardie said that he had come back more and more convinced that Socialism was the one hope of the world.

Task is to Galvanize. Keir Hardie's task is to galvanize the labor party, not merely into a political acceptance of a great social and economic truth, but to make it a fighting organization both in and out of parliament—a task of great magnitude.

The fact is there are two different theories in the labor and Socialist ranks about parliamentary tactics. Is it to be isolation or co-operation? Ramsay MacDonald has declared emphatically for co-operation. But Keir Hardie's attitude in parliament undoubtedly tends toward isolation.

Aggressive Socialists generally throughout Great Britain favor isolation. They argue that the more independent they are the more effective their parliamentary force. Hardie has won all his battles as an Ishmaelite.
