





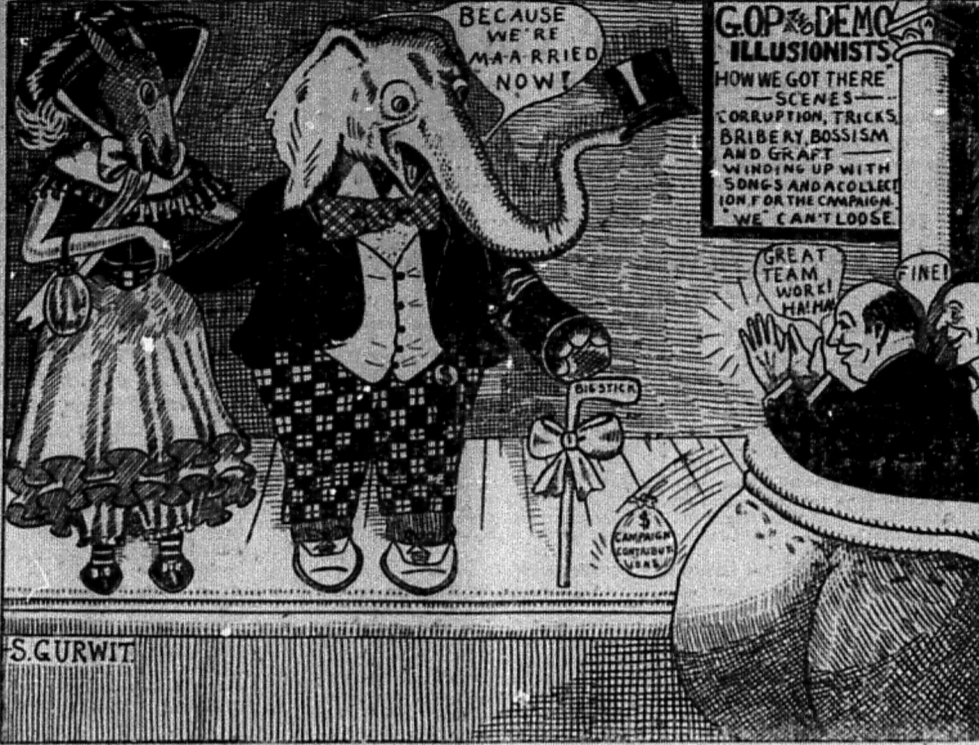


With Whom Will You Vote?
