The clocks are on the stroke of three, and the furrow plowed among the populace is turning round to come on into the place of execution.

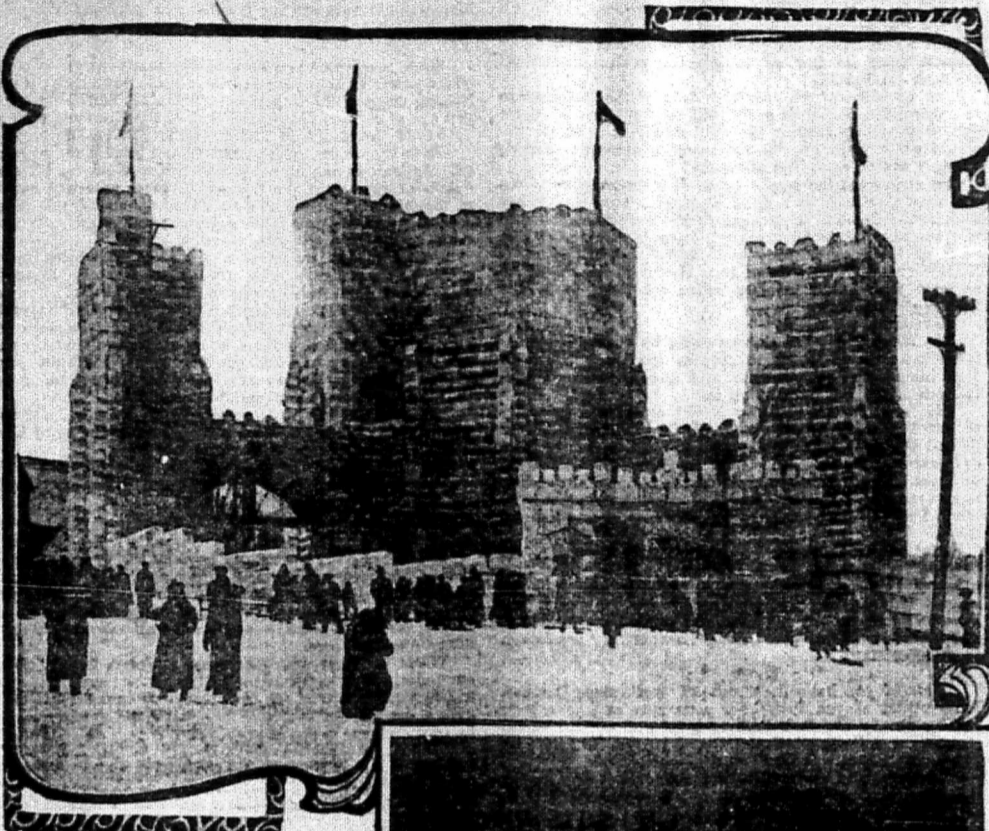
The second tumbril empties and moves on, the third comes up. Crash! And the knitting women, never faltering or pausing in their work, count "Twelve."

CRYSTAL PALACE IN MONTREAL

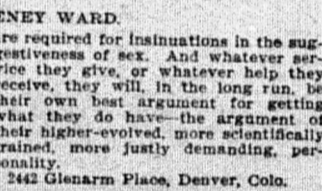


The Montreal ice carnival is the most successful one ever held in Canada. The ice palace shown in this picture is a marvelous structure, built of thousands of tons of ice.
