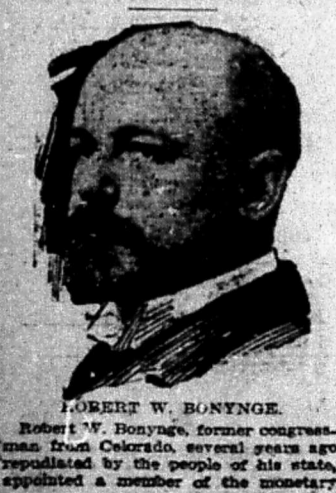

BERTH FOR FRANK SULLIVAN

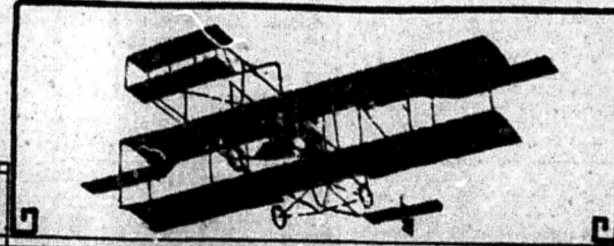
