ONE of the many retired rear-admirals floating around the open forums of the country recently admitted that wars are caused by conflict between nations over spheres of influence, markets and concessions. The old salt did not say anything wrong in this and that pacifists and others who had moral scruples about slitting other peoples' throats over a "port to export goods" should be conveniently hanged on general principles. The admiral's declaration is a delightful relief from the hypocritical twaddle put out by the sanctimonious capitalist propagandists who reduce all wars in which their own burglars are involved, to cruder in behalf of civilization, female virtue or religion.


