LABOR PARTY IS DEMAND OF REDS IN CLEVELAND

Call on the Unions to Support Conference

CLEVELAND, Ohio, July 14.—The Workers (Communist) Party of Cleveland has sent a letter to all labor organizations of this city pointing out the necessity for the labor party to work in the interests of the working class.

The letter, printed below, calls upon all labor bodies to endorse the call for a conference on the matter and their participation in the coming municipal elections here.

The letter follows: "To labor organizations of Cleveland: "With the approach of elections, the question comes to the front. What is the government doing for the worker?"

"The usual experience after elections has been a betrayal of the interests of labor by the successful candidates regardless of the amount of pro-labor votes they have secured during the campaign.

"In so now well known that the seven or eight candidates endorsed by organized labor and the Labor Action Central and allied radical groups have forgotten the workers whose votes elected them.

"Organized labor will remember the milk drivers' strike of three years ago when the city government refused to discuss on the wages to protect the milk.

"The street car men have fresh to their minds the freedom of the Biscuit in the strike-breaking practices recently adopted and the police provided the conditions for strike-breakers in times past.

"The city administration bitterly fought against the payment of union wages to city employees. Now they have again after the courts had decided in favor of the workers.

"When the garbage collector two years ago demanded a thirty percent increase in pay and a minimum wage in conditions, they found out that the city government is not willing to pay any other body to employ strike-breakers and bastards. It has no policy all ready to protect its profits.

"Labor must exert political power. The recent decision of the state supreme court against the state government to publish a "Trust" does of officers are reminders of the fact that the workers are not to be treated as citizens but as slaves who must not argue; that from the city to the government in the hands of the employing class which uses the governmental power to increase profits and keep down the wages.

"Workers offer abundant proof of the fact that what little has been gained by labor from a capitalist government has been only because of the political power it has secured. The cause labor has been so weak politically that it has not been able to do so. On the other hand, the government in the United States the working class, the powerful financial interests who must not, Destroy the Nation. The American plan is a plan for the capitalist interests which will give the government power to increase profits and keep down the wages.

"To fight the American plan and the open shop campaign means to fight not only the industrial control of the financial interests, but their political power as well.

"The Workers Party maintains that labor should abandon its present political party affiliations that will perpetuate the rule of the capitalist class. The policy of labor may come to the heads of so-called 'Progressive' party and by professional politicians and 'friends of labor' may also give up, because such parties are in the present business interests, it is one of the Wall Street interests of the city who are not only will increase their own interests in labor but also the labor vote of the city for their own candidates. Let labor form a labor party, composed of the organized and political and other organizations of workers willing to work on the basis of independent working class political action and common economic, the capitalist class.

"We urge upon your organization to give the fullest consideration to this question and to endorse the call of a conference on the formation of a labor party for Cleveland.

"Down with the industrial political rule of the open shop! Up with independent political action by the working class! Forward a labor party! Forward to workers' political action!
