Farrington's Power Plan An engineer's report published a few days ago approves the so-called giant power plants which are being built on the west side of District 12 of the United Mine workers of America.

The plan proposes: First: the organization of a semi-public corporation in which the operators of the power plants are held on a representative basis. Who is to pick the "consumers" we are not informed.

Second: the construction of this corporation one or more giant power plants on the Ohio and Mississippi rivers for the manufacture of electricity thru burning Illinois coal.

Third: to form an integral network of major and minor power lines to make electricity available to every home and business in the state.

Fourth: To treat coal at the giant power station in order to save and conserve the valuable by-products. Farrington is getting paid to look after the interests of the miners and not after the interests of the operators and the vague benefits of the public which are slight, but in every other improvement in the industrial machinery under capitalism.
