## FOREIGN TRADE TAKES JUMP IN SOVIET RUSSIA

### Internal Commerce Is Also on Increase

(Special to The Daily Worker)

**MOSCOW (By Tass).**—The internal commerce of Soviet Russia for the year ending on March 31, 1926, was 10,000,000,000 rubles, an increase of 30 percent over 1925. The volume of foreign trade has also increased, according to the economic department of the People's Commissariat of Internal Commerce.

Development is expected in connection with the planned 40 percent extension of the industrial system and the 45 percent increase of agricultural production.

As for the foreign trade balance, it is estimated that it will increase up to 1,500 million rubles in the current year 1926-1928.

## SOVIET RUSSIA EXPECTS CLOSER TIE WITH LATVIA

**Moscow (By Tass).**—The new Soviet minister of High, Chervinsk, in his first statement as Latvian president, pointed out that new proposals were being put on mutual relations between the USSR and Latvia (provisional to be concluded to both sides. It was with much satisfaction, he said, that the Soviet government took note of the growing interests among Latvian circles in favor of closer economic ties with the Soviet Union.

In reply, President Chervinsk stated that the Latvian people and the government were ever striving to bring about close relations with the great neighbor republic and were ever ready to take any step that could promote cooperation and economic rapprochement between the two peoples.

**Should Stop Anti-Soviet Aids.**—Comments on the statement of Chervinsk made by Soviet representatives by Mr. Morozov, Latvian minister of foreign affairs, while he was in Moscow, namely that the minister upon being asked as to what he was in East and, as such, wished to be in a position to make the economic ties between the two countries with the wish that the Latvian government should stop the anti-Soviet intentions and to ever leave off hostile propaganda and to give up anti-Soviet alliances.

On October 1, 1924, the Soviet Union's capital wealth, exclusive of land, aggregated 104,000,000,000 gold rubles. The value of the land on the territory of the Soviet Republics, gold rubles, of which the equivalent of 10,000,000,000 gold rubles was in possession of the population.

The capital wealth in small industry amounts to 44,000,000,000 gold rubles, which is less than one-seventh of the total for large-scale industry—4,400,000,000 gold rubles. Of the latter figure 4,570,000,000 gold rubles, or 77.4 per cent, falls to the world-wide scale, and on this basis establish the economic position of the Soviet Union as compared with the U. S. R. and the other countries.

"Having started its work two hundred years ago as a foreign institution, the Academy gradually began to be replenished with exclusively Russian forces. This fact did not make it a narrow national institution, the international character of its work leads to its most essential part of studying the nature and peoples of our country, a quite clear to everybody. This is also reflected in growing interest in the Academy."

Referring to one or two military notes of distrust spread by a very few foreign papers, such as the London Daily Worker, he stated that this has been inspired by political considerations.

## SOVIET UNION EXPORTS BULK OF FURS TO U. S.

### Fifty-one Million Rubles Worth, Total

**MOSCOW (By Tass).**—According to figures at the disposal of the People's Commissariat for Foreign Trade, 511 million rubles' worth of furs were exported abroad during the last six months (October-November). The first place in fur exports is held by the United States, which took 14.4 per cent, then follows Germany—12.5 per cent. However, America is the main consumer of furs, English and France following in third place.

The People's Commissariat for Foreign Trade (Narkomvostok) works through the USSR and the Soviet Republics in the chief export of Russian furs, in order to meet the demand of the world market.
