TODAY, Victor L. Berger, the Milwaukee "socialist" congressman, is back in Washington, D. C., waiting for a summons to call the house of representatives into session, to discuss the Red Cross. He said the stuff that will help him snug and comfortable in his seat 'neath the capitol's dome.

Like the good and faithful ally of capitalism that it is, Berger's Milwaukee Leader falls gracefully into line with an editorial starting off with this paragraph: It is our annual duty and pleasure to request our readers by Christmas seals.

It is a reminder of the war days when everyone was not only urged, but blackjacked into subscribing for the Red Cross. The Red Cross bonds were sold by the Red Cross to mention aid to the Salvation Army and similar paragonizing organizations, only the staunchest revolutionaries.

Berger, the "socialist," could not deny the truth of the matter. He had to back out of the Red Cross. He had deemed it bad policy to publicize. Not bad policy from the viewpoint of Berger.

FOR POWER OF WORKERS AND PEASANTS

MOSCOW, U. S. R. (By Mail).—The Czechoslovak workers' delegation that is visiting the Union of Soviet Republics has been greatly impressed by the power that the workers and peasants have in running the Soviet state. Baying Power of Farmers

Financial writers on the capitalist newspapers devote their peculiar talents to twisting economic facts to create the illusion of prosperity. The latest effort of this kind is a series of articles appearing in the Tuesday morning papers to the effect that the farmers really are prosperous, despite reports to the contrary.

The complaint of the merchants of the small towns serving agricultural communities is that the majority of the small town mail order houses get all the cash and that the town businessmen are asked to extend credit for goods not obtainable at the mail order centers, which is 10.21 per cent over a year ago.

This situation exists at the beginning of periods of depression. As the crisis grows and the farmers are unable to obtain money from their banks, they are forced to turn to the mail order centers. The stages of agricultural depression registered by the farmers are: the first is at the beginning of depression, when the farmers stock up on the cheap goods from the mail order houses in order to make their meager farms as far as possible. This shows an increase in mail orders over normal times. The second is when the crisis reaches its peak and the farmers are without funds, which means that they are unable to pay for the goods they have ordered.

Agricultural depression results in many of the small stores going out of existence and not infrequently carries down with them banks that extend them credit. The final result of such a crisis is similar to all others, further concentration of capital in the hands of the combine.
