DOCTORS KEEP WORKERS FROM COMPENSATION

Steel Co. Able to Dodge State Law

WARREN, O. Dec. 6.—How the employment of "company" doctors being to evade and break down the state laws for compensation for injury is shown plainly in the Carnegie Steel Co. works.

In the opinion of the surgeon, your injuries result in loss of time exceeding one week, you are entitled to compensation. This is the way the law is explained to the worker. The doctor in this case is the company's own doctor to care for the men and injured workers are hurried back to work, whether cured or not, before the week is up.

Former Firm Workers Back
With cases, crooked and hand-picked men forced to keep back to the shop, and if unable to work, to still receive pay, it is in order that the company's expense of paying compensation is reduced to a minimum.

When "doctor" reports that the company's paying compensation is "absolutely necessary," the report too often are fired or black listed. They are then held to their jobs, they must force their injured men to come back to work before compensation is made.
