FRANCE PUT WHOLE BY THE BRITISH

Must Fight for Mosoul or Lose Pet Plan

(Special to The Daily Worker) PARIS, Dec. 25.—The French are in a peculiar position toward the proposal, blandly set forth by Great Britain, that if Turkey makes war to keep the Mosoul oil field, it is the business of France and other members of the league of nations to contribute armies and naval forces to enforce the mandate of the league.

France and everyone else not in the league, knows that the real reason for Mosoul oil is a quarrel between Britain and Turkey, with the kind of Iraq being merely the pawn of British imperialist policy from the league of nations.

ZANKOV PLANS TERROR REIGN IN BULGARIA

Will Murder Jailed Communists. (Special to The Daily Worker) MOSCOW, U. S. S. R., Dec. 24.—The working class press of Europe is sounding the alarm against the workmen in connection with the threatening news from Bulgaria on the revival of the wave of terror by Zankov.

FRENCH AND DJEBEL DROUSE TRIBESMEN SIGN ARMISTICE IN SYRIA

LONDON, Dec. 24.—An armistice between the French and Djebel Drouse tribesmen in Syria has been signed by French High Commissioner De Gaulle, according to a telegraph dispatch from Cairo. The report declares that under the terms of the armistice, political prisoners are to be liberated.

Sultan Atrah, leader of the Djebel Drouse, has declared that he would not make peace with the French. He has demanded the establishment of an indemnity country, but has stated that he is willing to have tribute paid to exercise a protectorate over Syria.

REPORT LEWIS TO TALK PEACE ON ANY TERMS

GRIP OF WALL STREET-OWNED MACHADO RULE ON COMMUNIST PARTY SECRETARY IS BROKEN

(By Cable to The Daily Worker) HAVANA, Cuba, Dec. 24.—The case of Julio Antonio Mella, secretary of the Communist Party of Cuba, which for nearly three weeks has stirred the workers and anti-imperialist forces of the two American continents to protest, has resulted in a clear-cut defeat for American imperialism.

Physicians say that owing to his weakened condition he could not have lived for more than a week longer if he had continued refusing food. His voluntary arrest, maintained in the face of requests for his release by student organizations that he give up what appeared to be a useless sacrifice, frustrated the whole aim of American imperialist domination in Cuba and made it possible to mobilize the sentiment for national liberation behind him.

The campaign to free Mella was a great victory for the working class and marked an important step in the development of a homogeneous movement in Cuba. Especially was it a triumph for the All American Anti-Imperialist League, which is a revolutionary force in this movement.
