

'Socialists' Fail, Communists File Candidates in Racine

Collect "Surprising Number" of Signatures for Elections in "Socialist" Town

(Telegram to the Daily Worker) MILWAUKEE, Wis., Sept. 16.—Socialists failed to file petitions in the first congressional district election to fill the vacancy of H. A. Cooper, on October 13th according to a Madison dispatch, although they only needed a few hundred, being a legal party.

The signatures were gotten in Racine, Wis., where the Communist Party and the Unemployed Council have been leading the struggle of the unemployed against the socialist party mayor.

Workers here will carry on a whirlwind election campaign shaking up five industrial and farming counties in the district.

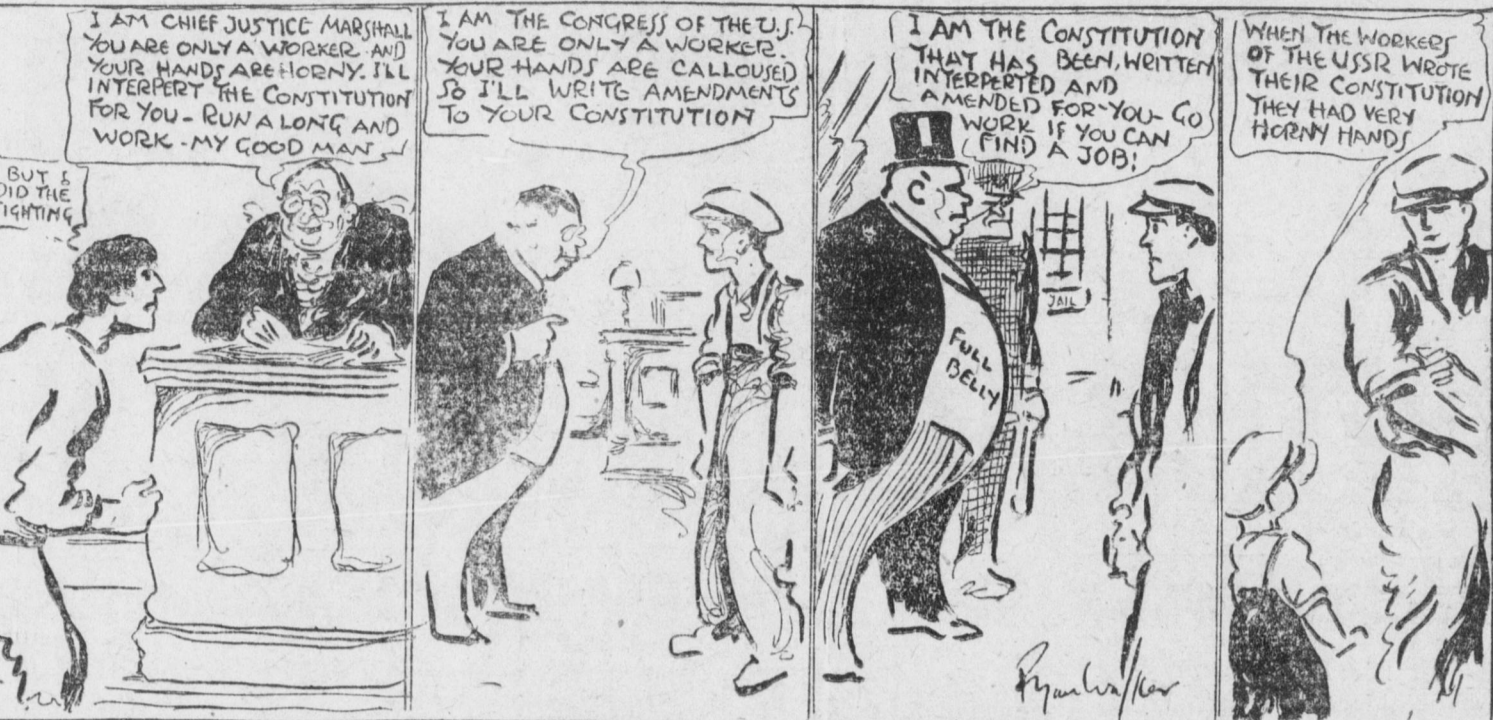
