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NATION HEARS BROWDER WINDUP CAMPAIGN AS OVERFLOW CROWD MILLS IN STREETS AT GARDEN

20,000 CHEER CANDIDATE AT GARDEN RALLY

Krumbein Presides at Huge Meeting Minor, Amter, Herndon Cheered by Crowds

More than 25,000 workers and progressives—Negro and white—stormed Madison Square Garden last night in a wind-up Communist election rally which broke all-time records.

The tumultuous ovation accorded Earl Browder, Communist candidate for President, set a new high for demonstrations given to presidential candidates in the spacious sports arena.

As Browder spoke his running mate, James W. Ford, Negro Communist Vice-Presidential candidate, was addressing thousands in the huge Chicago stadium.

EIGHT SPEAKERS

The meeting opened promptly at 8 o'clock with the dramatic entrance of the entire slate of Communist state candidates followed by a five-minute ovation. Preceding them was a color guard of about 100 Negro and white members of the Young Communist League, bearing American and red hammer and sickle flags.

Among the candidates were: Bob Minor, candidate for Governor; Julian Sawyer, Negro candidate for Lieutenant-Governor; Israel Amter, candidate for president of the Board of Aldermen; Grace Hutchins, candidate for comptroller and others.

KRUMBEIN PRESIDES

The opening gavel was sounded by Carl Brodsky, Communist State campaign manager, who introduced Charles Krumbein, the chairman, as a "devoted and loyal" leader of the working class. There was a burst of applause.

Krumbein announced at 8:30 that the Garden was jammed and that a huge overflow crowd listened on the outside.

The first thunderous shouts that shook the arena came when Krumbein said that "every support must be given to the Spanish people's struggle for democracy against fascism."

The jubilant spirit of the meeting zoomed forth again, as Krumbein introduced Angelo Herndon, young Negro leader, and declared "he must be kept off the Georgia chain-gang."

HERNDON SPEAKS

Herndon spoke calmly and clearly, although his speech was frequently interrupted by spontaneous applause.

As each of the speakers arose a banner shot out announcing which of the Communist Party's election planks they would discuss. Amter spoke on unemployment; John Little, youth leader on "Save the Young Generation"; Briehl, Candidate for attorney general, on "Free the farmers from debt and foreclosures"; and so on until all of the planks had been covered.

Other speakers were: Grace Hutchins; Irving Schwab, candidate for judge of General sessions; Julian Sawyer; Bob Minor, who discussed the Party's anti-war plank and state election issues.

SAYS BATTLE FOR LIBERTY ONLY BEGUN

Urges Building Farmer-Labor Party To Halt March of Fascism In America

Earl Browder, Communist Candidate for President, struck one more blow at the forces of fascism in a last powerful election eve speech in his Party's campaign for a "free, happy and prosperous America."

He announced that this night was but the beginning of a new drive forward for liberty.

He called for votes for the Communist ticket to strengthen this campaign.

Twenty thousand people in Madison Square Garden roared their approval, and untold millions listened in a nation-wide radio broadcast of the speech.

Browder urged the building of the Communist Party so that it could do its part to unite all progressive forces in a real Party.

American People: Defeat Landon! Build Farmer-Labor Party! Vote Communist!

AN EDITORIAL

UPON American men and women, going to the polls today, there rests a great responsibility.

The Communist Party has not said lightly that 1936 presents the greatest crisis to the American people since the election of 1860. Then, the fight was against the Slave Power, darkly menacing all American freedom. Today, the issue is the ominous threat of Fascism, endangering all American democratic rights.

We call upon the men and women casting their ballots today, TO DEFEND AND EXTEND DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS. How can they do this? By the defeat of Landon, puppet of the Hearst-Liberty League-Republican pro-fascist forces. By voting Communist, for the front-line fighters against fascism, for the force dedicated to the creation of a People's Front: a Farmer-Labor Party.

AMERICAN workers: defeat Landon, vote Communist. For the maintenance and extension of the trade unions; for full victory for the right to organize, without interference by open shoppers or government; for the growth and development of the American labor movement; for the ending of taxation on the poor and the placing of the tax burden on the rich; for the inauguration of adequate social insurance legislation; paid for entirely by employing interests; for the extension of the WPA and the winning of adequate relief, which this rich nation can give to those out of work through no fault of their own.

AMERICAN farmers: defeat Landon, vote Communist. For the freeing of the farmers from debts, the unbearable tax burdens and foreclosures; for the preservation of the land for those who till the soil; for the ending of evictions; for aid to the drought-stricken farmers out of the pockets of those for whom Landon stands, the rich interests of the nation; for government regulation of farm prices in order to guarantee to the farmer his cost of production.

AMERICAN women: defeat Landon, vote Communist. For equal rights and equal opportunities for women, against the degradation of women that the pro-fascist forces stand for; for the struggle for peace through the advancement of collective security, against the war-mongering policies of Hearst and the du Ponts.

AMERICAN Negro people: defeat Landon, vote Communist. For the party which has fought with you and for your rights year and year out; for equal rights and against the oppression of the Negro people, against the forces that would make lynch law the law of the land; for the full right to vote, organize, serve on juries and hold public office; for the death penalty for lynchers, for the complete enforcement of the 13th, 14th and 15th Amendments.

Thousands Cheer Ford And Foster in Chicago

Foster and Mother Bloor Acclaimed by Stadium Crowd at Final Campaign Meeting in Windy City—Hear Browder Over Radio

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 2.—As we go to press, thousands of workers are pouring into the Chicago Stadium early tonight to listen to the final Communist election rally of this campaign.

Late in the program the audience will hear Earl Browder, Communist Presidential candidate, as he broadcasts over the radio from Madison Square Garden, New York. Browder's voice was to be presented to the throng by Morris Childs, chairman of the Illinois campaign committee.

Three outstanding Communist speakers were slated to speak here tonight. They are James Ford,

AMERICAN young people: defeat Landon, vote Communist. For the real opportunities and education to which you are entitled, as embodied in the American Youth Act; for jobs, educational opportunities and vocational training for all young people between the ages of 16 and 25; against those forces who would seek to use the youth as the shock troops of reaction and imperialist wars, and for the youth's own further exploitation and defeat.

AMERICAN people as a whole: defeat Landon, vote Communist. To advance the struggle for peace; to keep America out of war by keeping war out of the world; to secure peace by the only road possible, the adoption of a policy of collective security by the United States, with measures to that end against the war-mongering countries, Hitlerite Germany, fascist Italy and militarist Japan. To build up, instead of great armaments, an American Peace Policy in close collaboration with the Soviet Union; and to bring about immediate nationalization of the entire munitions industry.

DEFEAT Landon, vote Communist. To rid these United States of the darkening menace of fascism, represented by the concentration of the most reactionary capitalist forces back of the Landon-Knox ticket. To smash these pro-fascist forces through the creation of a People's Front—those pro-fascist forces against which Roosevelt has shown that he can be no barrier. To encourage the development of the Farmer-Labor Party, mighty lever for the preservation of democratic rights, the smashing of fascism, and for the keeping open of the road to Socialism.

A vote for the Communist Party—for Earl Browder and James W. Ford and for the entire Communist ticket—is a vote toward the building of the Farmer-Labor Party, in the continued fight for the extension of democratic rights.
