**PUBLICITY BRINGS
RELIEF TO W. VA.**

Charleston, W. Va., May 22.—
With the committee of Social Demo-
crats on the ground to investigate
conditions of miners who took part
in the recent strike, with Governor
Hatfield giving ground as publicity
reveals his gradual shift in favor
of the mine owners, with the mili-
tary prisoners (free and with reason-
able assurance that the United States
Senate will probe the "ouster" un-
der which the workers have been ex-
ploited, hope for redress and a sense
of readjustment of conditions is held
out to those who have felt the iron
hand of capitalism with its militia
and detective thugs.

**FAMILY DEAD BY GAS
AWAITING EVICTION.**
Philadelphia.—On the eve of
eviction from their humble home,
the bodies of Frederick Schimmel,
45, his wife, Minnie, and their 1-year
old daughter were found exsanguinated
this afternoon. Circumstances
under which the lifless forms were
found indicate suicide.

The family thus wiped out was
found fully dressed, lying across a
newly made bed, when the police
broke into their bed-room. The
husband and wife were draped tight-
ly in each other's arms, and the girl
was partly under the bed clothes, in-
dicating a struggle to escape the ac-
tion of the deadly gas.

Neighbors of the Schimmels told
the police that the family had been
recently on account of the husband's
barber business dwindling away,
and that the constant bad
notified the family that he would
be compelled to enter today un-
der the rent was paid.

**LOS ANGELES WANTS
MUNICIPAL CAR LINE**

Los Angeles.—Adopting the re-
port of the municipal railway com-
mittee, the city council has gone on
record in favor of the city taking
over and operating the Temple
street car line when the franchise
expires in about two years and a
half. If this plan is carried out the
Temple street line will be the first mu-
nicipal owned and operated line in
the city.

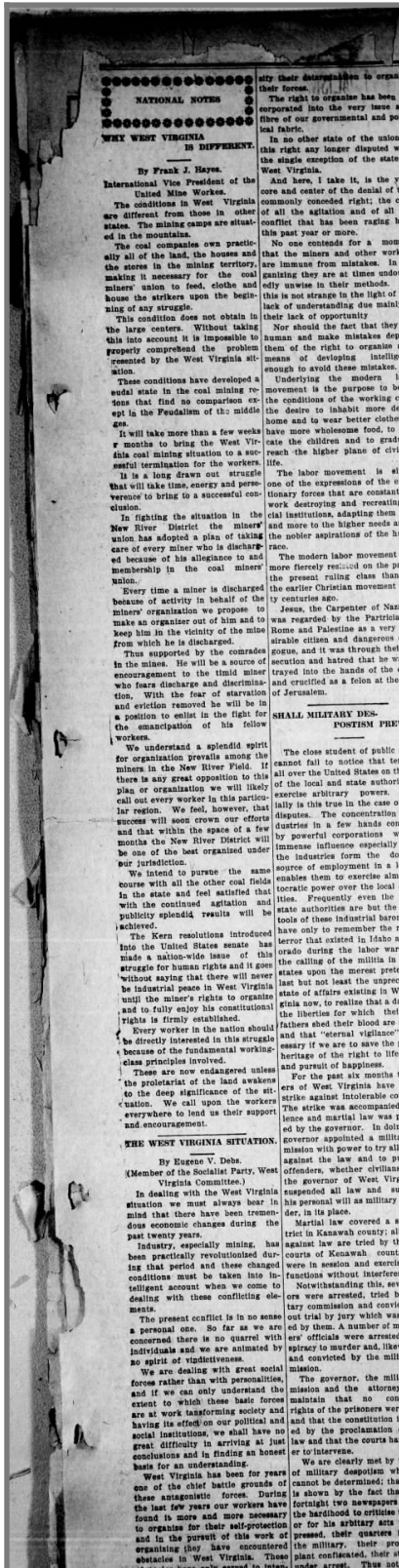

WEST VIRGINIA IN DIFFERENCE

International Vice President of the United Mine Workers. The conditions in West Virginia are different from those in other states. The mine camps are situated in the mountains. The coal companies own practically all of the land, the houses and the stores in the mine territory, making it necessary for the coal miners to feed, clothe and house the strikers upon the beginning of any struggle. This condition does not obtain in the large centers. Without taking this into account it is impossible to properly comprehend the problem presented by the West Virginia situation.

These conditions have developed a social state in the coal mining regions that find no comparison except in the Peasants of the middle east. It will take more than a few weeks to bring the West Virginia coal mining situation to a successful termination for the workers. It is a long drawn out struggle that will take time, energy and perseverance to bring to a successful conclusion.

In fighting the situation in the New River District the miners union has adopted a policy of non-violence. The miners are discharged because of his allegiance to and membership in the coal miners union. Every time a miner is discharged because of activity in behalf of the miners in the New River field, it is a source of encouragement to the miners from which he is discharged. Thus supported by the comrades in the mine. He will be a source of encouragement to the miners who fear discharge and discrimination. With the fear of starvation and eviction removed he will be in a position to enlist in the fight for the emancipation of his fellow workers.

We understand a splendid spirit for organization prevails among the miners in the New River field. If there is any great opposition to this plan or organization we will likely call out every worker in this particular region. We feel, however, that success will soon crown our efforts and that within the space of a few months the New River District will be one of the best organized under our jurisdiction.

We intend to pursue the same course with all the other coal fields in the state and feel satisfied that with the continued agitation and publicity splendid results will be achieved. The Kern resolutions introduced into the United States senate has made a nation-wide issue of the struggle for human rights and it will never be industrial peace in this country until the miner's rights to organize and to fully enjoy his constitutional rights is firmly established.

Every worker in the nation should be directly interested in this struggle because of the fundamental working class principles involved. These are no less endangered unless the proletarian of the land wakens to the deep significance of the situation. We call upon the workers everywhere to lend us their support and encouragement.

WEST VIRGINIA SITUATION

(Member of the Socialist Party, West Virginia Committee). In dealing with the West Virginia situation we must always bear in mind that there have been tremendous economic changes during the past twenty years. Industry, especially mining, has been practically revolutionized during that period and these changed conditions must be taken into intelligent account when we come to dealing with these conflicting elements. The present conflict is in no sense a personal one. So far as we are concerned there is no quarrel with individuals and we are animated by no spirit of vindictiveness. We are dealing with great social forces rather than with persons and if we can only understand the extent to which these social forces are at work transforming the conditions of the miners we will have the effect of our political and social institutions, we shall have no great difficulty in arriving at the conclusions and in finding an honest basis for an understanding. West Virginia has been the scene of the chief battle grounds of these antagonistic forces. During the last few years our workers have found in more and more necessary to organize for their self-protection and in the present of this work of organizing they have encountered obstacles in West Virginia. These obstacles have only served to intensify their determination to organize their forces.

THE RIGHT TO ORGANIZE HAS BEEN INCORPORATED INTO THE VERY LATEST OF OUR GOVERNMENTAL AND POLITICAL TARIFFS.

In no other state of the union is this right any longer disputed with the single exception of the state of West Virginia.

And here, I take it, is the very core and center of the denial of this commonly conceded right, the core of all the agitation and of all the conflict that has been raging here this past year or more. No one contends for a moment that the miners and other workers are immune from mistakes. In organizing they are at times undoubtedly wrong in their methods. But this is not strange in the light of this lack of understanding due mainly to their lack of opportunity.

Nor should the fact that they are human and make mistakes deprive them of the right to organize as a means of developing intelligence enough to avoid these mistakes. Underlying the modern labor movement is the purpose to better the conditions of the working class, the desire to inhabit more decent homes and to wear better clothes, to have more wholesome food, to educate the children and to gradually reach the higher plane of civilization.

The labor movement is simply one of the expressions of the evolutionary forces that are constantly at work destroying and recreating social institutions, adapting them more and more to the higher needs and to the nobler aspirations of the human race.

The modern labor movement is no more fiercely red on the part of the present ruling class than was the earlier Christian movement two centuries ago. Jesus, the Carpenter of Nazareth, was regarded by the Patriarchs of Judea and Palestine as a very undesirable citizen and dangerous demagogue, and it was through their persecution and hatred that he has been betrayed into the hands of the enemy and crucified as a felon at the gates of Jerusalem.

SHALL MILITARY DISCIPLINE PREVAIL?

The close student of public affairs cannot fail to notice that tendency all over the United States to give the local and state authorities to exercise arbitrary powers. Especially in the case of labor disputes. The concentration of industry in a few hands controlled by powerful corporations has immense influence especially where the industries form the dominant source of employment in a locality. enables them to exercise almost unopposed power over the local authorities. Frequently even the highest state authorities are but the willing tools of these industrial barons. We have only to remember the reign of terror that existed in Idaho and Colorado during the labor war there, the calling of the militia in various states upon the most pretense, and last but not least the unprecedented state of affairs existing in West Virginia now, to realize that a danger of the liberties for which their forefathers shed their blood is at stake and that "martial vigilance" is necessary if we are to save the precious heritage of the right to life, liberty and pursuit of happiness.

For the past six months the miners of West Virginia have been on strike against intolerable conditions. The strike was accompanied by violence and martial law was proclaimed by the governor. In doing so the governor appointed a military commission with power to try all offenders against the law and to punish all offenders, whether civilians or not, the governor of West Virginia has suspended all of law and substituted his personal will as military commander, in its place.

Martial law covered a small district in Kanawha county; all offenses against law are tried by the county courts of Kanawha county, which were in session and exercising their functions without interference. Notwithstanding this, several miners were arrested, tried by a military commission and convicted without trial by jury which was demanded by law. A number of mine workers' officials were arrested for conspiracy to murder and likewise tried and convicted by the military commission.

Every trial involves the exercise of judicial power and from what source did the Military Commission derive the right to exercise this authority? Certainly, no part of the judicial power of the country was conferred upon them; because the Constitution expressly vests it in the Supreme Court and such inferior Courts as Congress may from time to time ordain and establish; and it is not pretended that the commission was a Court of record and established by Congress. They cannot justify on the ground that they were acting under the authority of the governor. The governor has no power to create a court of record and establish it by his own authority.
