WILL URGH THAT POSTOFFICES
BE MADE LABOR EMPLOY-
MENT BUREAUS.

WASHINGTON—The bill will
soon be reported from the Com-
mittee on the House to establish a
national employment bureau under
the supervision of the department
of labor, using the postoffice all
over the country as labor employ-
ment bureau.

Certain first or second class post-
offices in the larger cities will be
designated as "central labor em-
ployment" for specific districts, and
which will include all the third and
fourth class postoffices within a given
radius.

Workers seeking positions will be
able to file their postmaster or
postmistress as application for em-
ployment, and the latter will be
obliged to forward the same to the
proper authorities.

The federal department could re-
ceive the use of the service to
investigate violations of
ordinances prescribing fire escapes,
protection of dangerous machinery,
and other necessary
information.

Employers in need of workers
could apply to the postmaster or
postmistress for the same, and the
latter would be obliged to forward
the same to the proper authorities.

At the end of 24 hours a work-
er's application has not secured him
a position in the local "labor mar-
ket," it is sent to the central labor
exchange for the district, and if
not posted and sent out to the
postoffice in that district.

Does to Larger Towns.
It at the end of a week he is still
out of employment, his application
will be sent to the larger zone or "de-
partment," and from there, after a spe-
cified time to the national labor ex-
change, which under the plan is
speed, publishes a weekly or monthly
bulletin showing all applicants
for positions and all positions open.

The effect of the scheme gives an
estimatedly widening field to the
worker and the employer in the
search for or fill a position. The
worker is thus automatically placed
in touch with the labor market.
