THE NEW HAVEN MYSTERY

The New York World of May 23, 1914, editorially discussed "The New Haven Mystery." The editor said: "Charles J. Malloy, mayor of the New Haven, has been selling on the witness stand the most incredible story of corporate corruption. The country has been told of the life-insurance investigation. "In many respects the two stories run parallel. We have the same kind of story, by highly respectable financiers; the same consciousness of other people's money; the same corruption of government; the same alliance with crooked politics; the same debauching of newspapers and of public opinion; the same trade of integrity and ruin.

"What was in the minds of Mr. Malloy and Mr. Rockefeller?

"The question which they forced the New Haven into this policy and guided it to plunder and disaster? The public opinion of the country, that of these were many millions of men. They did not need power, and interchangeable means of acquiring power.

"They could not have believed that their scandalous exploitation of this great property would bring them power and influence in the life of finance. They could not have believed that they would gain a new measure of popularity by such a proceeding.

"They were in the way of an extraordinary that drove them to this device. What they did they did in cold blood and with full realization. What, then, is the mystery of their conduct?"

"The world can find no answer to this question.

"These men admittedly represented the best that there is in the World. Their opinions were the opinions of the financial world. Their judgments were regarded as well-nigh infallible. Wall Street was proud of their conduct, and the public justified them. Yet look at their work!"

"Were they, too, victims of a system which they had created, and by such methods and such measures? Is America finance on such a basis that respectable burghers is the best that can be expected of it?"

"The World does not undertake to answer these questions, but it is time that an answer be sought."

"Very well-informed Socialists have the correct answer to the World's question. I suspect that they can give the answer in the true remedy that would cure the trouble mentioned, and prevent by means of wrecking railroads by the means of spreading ruin to many thousands of people, but probably there is a reason for their 'shallow' view of the remedy. The correct answer can be written down in six words, viz:

"THE NATION OWN THE RAILROADS."

It looks like the editors of the World, while correctly diagnosing the trouble, have completely overlooked the remedy, knowing as he does that Morris, Rockefeller & Co., are not dead, but are still doing business as us old men, and that the criterion is the better part of value on the part of a publisher who is on the lookout for "sales" for his newspaper. Once upon a time Colonel Burton, the "Fiercest One" on his return from Europe, said to the railroads, "You should own the railroads," but the hit was hardly due to the newspapers in which that speech was made before the Wall Street newspapers got busy and caused the mouth of the "Fiercest Statesman" to shut up tightly, and the speech never has been heard from him on that subject. The World doubtless remembers that episode, and thinks the better plan is to let the railroads to that answer them. I am, however, glad that the editor says, "It is time that an answer be sought."

With due respect to the American people, I ask, how long will they permit a few men to run, for private profit, one of the most important public utilities, and then, according to reliable authority, cost them not a dollar, and they were given rich lands and the use of millions of acres of the six of the Middle States. In their greed for more, they have charged for the same service from three to six times more than a fair profit on the actual cost of the land and water. The subsidized price, mounted the profits, and created the moral of a good nation.

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or large interests fear that the state may go into business in competition with them. Hence, they want the state weakened in its power to tax.

No. 75 proposes to increase the tax on gas, not exceeding two per cent on gas and petroleum; but it exempts from taxation all machinery, appliances and equipment, and all oil and gas leases. An oil producer may have thousands and tens of thousands of dollars in machinery and equipment, but it is wholly exempt from taxation. This may have a loss worth a million dollars.

The bill provides that one-half of the two per cent on gas and oil be covered into the state treasury for the general expenses of the state government, and the other half shall be divided between the road and bridge fund and the school fund of the county where the oil and gas are mined and produced.

Our platform demands that the production of gas and oil, but a producer demand that the state should tax this source shall be used primarily for the benefit of the workers injured, and for the relief of the widows and orphans of the workers killed in such industries. In the event of an over-plus, Article 23 of the state constitution provides that:

"In view of the many distressing cases, where, after the death of the father of the family, the widow is unable to provide for the support of her life for herself and children, and of the resultant injury to the community, with the right of one of the widows in the interest of the state, to the young children and those incapacitated by injury or illness."

"We, the people, do hereby enact, that the widows and orphans of the workers in the cities, but for the widows and orphans of the landless tenant farmers."
