WELLOW CITIZENS:

We greet you as citizens about to exercise for the first time, the right to vote. It is as voters I address you—persons who having the power to determine what MEASURES you wish to see carried out, and what persons you wish to place in positions of trust and responsibility. It is my purpose to make a direct appeal to the reason and conscience of the woman voter.

I will not approach you indirectly, but with utmost frankness. I will tell you what we stand for. I will reveal to you the spirit with which we approach the great social task set before us.

I will explain the sacred purpose of this Socialist cause and show you that, no matter what the enemy of justice and our opponents may do to the contrary the deepest prayers of the hearts of women at this hour in human history can be answered only through the spirit and program of Socialism.

Having thus spoken to your deepest sense of right and truth, in the name of humanity and justice, I will frankly and directly appeal to you for votes, and to help transform an unjust, repressive, and cruel system of justice and human brotherhood.

1. Woman's Problem. The problem of women is not simply to secure the right of suffrage. The ballot is but a means to an end. The ballot is only a weapon with which you are now equipped to fight the real battles which are before you—the real battles for the great realities that underlie a free, happy and complete human existence. The "Practical Woman" in a recent issue said: "We need not point out that the steel trust, the oil trust, the coal trust, the beef trust, the woolen trust, and other similar corporations, have long since made it impossible for concern with small capital to compete successfully in their market." To prove their point the editor adds: "The majority of the business firms that have recently failed and gone into bankruptcy had a capital of \$10,000 or less. This week the same melancholy record was made, and actually 91 per cent of the 139 business houses that failed through the country during the week had a capital of \$10,000 or less."

"These small manufacturing and small business men are being crowded to the wall by the trusts. These men and women must compete with the workers already struggling in an over-crowded labor market."

This is your business, woman. Not only your husbands and fathers and sons, but you, yourselves, as workers, are brought face to face with the problem of human life.

MODERN BETSY ROSS MAKING FIRST U. S. FLAG OF PEACE.

Miss Henrietta Crossman Making U. S. Flag of Peace.

Chicago, Oct. 13.—"If of each of the flags of the world were to have a white border, indicative of peace, so that the flag might stand for all it did before and be a banner of peace, as well, it would be a better flag and all other nations would have better flags," said the Rev. A. T. Pennington of Los Angeles, Oct. 13, Sunday in his congregation.

Miss Henrietta Crossman, the famous actress, read the above remarks and immediately set about to put the idea into practice. She stitched a white border on an American silk flag with all the patriotism and reverence with which Betty Ross sewed between the first red and white stripes and placed the original 12 little white stars on their blue field. Each loop of thread was put in place with a prayer that peace may soon come about in war-torn Europe.

The first "Flag for peace" is now on exhibition in this city. It will be presented to President Wilson by Miss Crossman after opening her engagement in a Washington theater.

"CO-OPERATION IN THE NEW WORLD."

Workers must look arms and march on together," said Professor George R. Wicker, in one of his lectures on economics at the University of California summer session, June 24, 1914.

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
