KITCHEN ECONOMICS

No matter how careful the housewife may be in the selection of foods, unless they are properly cooked their value is destroyed. In fact it is more than destroyed for ill-cooked food is a positive menace to health.

Cooking is a chemical process. Although few women seem to think of it in this light and the proper preparation of foods requires acquaintance with the laboratory chemist.

It is astonishing how many women really do not know how to cook properly.

Arising from this condition and as a direct result of it, we have the large number of nationally advertised "ready-to-eat" foods which are sold on the market. And these products are fitted a definite and valuable place in household economy.

Many things enter into good scientific cooking. The kind of coal you use, the matter of getting the oven to the exact temperature, the way for the proper cooking of the particular food that happens to be in process of making, the precise amount of time necessary to complete the operation and yet not permit the food to become overdone. All these things the accomplished cook must know about in addition to possessing knowledge of food values and combinations, and, even though it sometimes goes against their work with little head to rules, it will generally be found that the expert-cure of the operation in the fry of long practice and of knowledge as thoroughly absorbed as to be a part of their being.

Women of today have many things to escape their attention other than the practice of kitchen chemistry and perhaps this is the reason why the present generation is not developing so many of those splendid cooks who earlier in time when a theoretical culinary education, but rather practical experience in the kitchen, was deemed absolutely essential for every young woman.

There are 400,000 women in general occupations in Ohio. According to the report of the Ohio Industrial Commission of 1917, a large number of these are getting less than \$5 a week. Many of these children get \$1 a week, most of them get less than \$4.

Now, it is not to be denied that law can do everything. Good laws need public opinion back of them. How shall we get a healthy public opinion in Ohio? By living public opinion. Give women votes, and you will feel the social temperature begin to rise at once on the industrial situation in this state.

BACK IN THE SADDLE

Socialist Party the Only Hope Henceforth

On the whole the results of the present campaign are good. The Socialist party comes out of the battle stronger and better than ever. It is not alone in the election success. But in others we have gained. Averaging the results we may fairly claim that the socialist study has made considerable advance which always characterizes the socialist movement as a gain in evidence.

It is to be noted in the election success that the Socialist Party makes progress. Other elements enter and particularly in the case of the minority party which is largely without a daily press, fighting for recognition and being out with clever and powerful majority parties. It also with a reform party that offers at least a promise of success for radical action outside the socialist party.

Election Gains.

Glancing at the election results the Socialist Party is not without its laurels.

As we go to press word comes of the election of Meyer London, of the 17th New York district to the United States Congress. This is the second Socialist elected to congress in America and the first elected in New York as well as in Wisconsin and elsewhere.

The election of London to Congress partly atones for the failure to land Berger and Gaylord in the Milwaukee district where the Socialists of state victory have been greater hopes for the next congressional battle.

In Pennsylvania, the election of James H. Maurer to the State Legislature indicates that success is coming back to the party in the legislative field. It is too early to report results in other states except in Wisconsin and Illinois. In Wisconsin the scholars are reported to have carried the county, electing the sheriff, district attorney and judges. As usual a strong group of representatives are elected to the state legislature.

In Illinois the party elects Madison and Madison and Harris. While the loss of the latter is to be regretted, yet in view of the loss of the majority in a three year term in the congress, the disheartening of the movement and the terrific landslide back to the democratic and republican parties, the holding of two seats in the state legislature is regarded as an encouraging result.

Returns from the state legislature are coming in, but it is believed that the party is either holding its own or making steady gains.

Reactionaries in the saddle. But election returns after all, are only the driftwood on the tide of national affairs. There are signs of reaction to the events of this campaign.

Reaction everywhere is back in the saddle. Reform radicals are everywhere beaten down. Nothing is left for the people save but Socialism.

Joe Cannon goes back to congress from the 17th Illinois district. The party was over crushed by over 100,000. Governor Perdue of Michigan, whose attitude towards the reformers in their struggle with the Catholic church was not all reactionary and his own members could be elected. And one A. C. Carter, republican, who had been elected, gave into the governor's chair in Colorado.

And strangely enough on the very day that the working people were meeting their battle for democratic reform, the reactionaries were making their move.
