## WESTERN HYPOCRISY AND IMMORALITY EXPOSED: PLOT AGAINST DECOLONIZATION OF NAMIBIA.

As expected, the three Western members of the Security Council, namely, Britain, France and the United States of America, have, once again, defied the wishes of the vast majority of the international community in particular, Africa, by vetoing the Resolutions aimed at imposing comprehensive mandatory sanctions against racist South Africa.

SWAPO is, however, not surprised by this arrogant use of veto, because we have always maintained that, by supplying sophisticated weapons, military and nuclear technological know-how and by their increasing economic links with racist South Africa, the imperialist States not only sustain but also nurture the racist, terrorist minority regime in South Africa in its colonial, murderous and aggressive policies against the South African and Namibian peoples and the neighbouring independent African States, especially Angola, Zambia and Mozambique.

By their negative vetoes, the Western governments have also come out clearly against the political aspirations of the Namibian people to be free and independent, and in full support of a terroristic and fascistic Pretoria regime which oppresses our people.

We have repeatedly made it clear that in the face of an eminent defeat of their clients in Pretoria, the Western countries can go to any extent in their determined efforts to install a neo-colonial, puppet regime in Namibia which will dutifully safeguard economic, political and strategic interests in the name of the "Western Christian Civilisation."

It is precisely for these reasons that the Western Five, especially the new US Administration are determined to destroy UN Security Council Resolution 435 (1978) which is a result of three years of protracted negotiations which they initiated.

We would like to ask the Western countries to tell the world what they have found wrong or weak in their own proposal. Why can they not gather courage and "morality" to say openly that they have, later on, discovered that, if implemented in its present form, the UN Plan will lead Namibia to genuine independence under the leadership of SWAPO, which they are not prepared to see and that, all what they are interested in is to have their puppets imposed on our people? Why being deceitful and hypocritical all these years?

SWAPO strongly condemns the Western governments for their use of veto to block peaceful means of accelerating the achievement of the independence of Namibia as well as for their attempts to sabotage implementation of Resolution 435.
